

RECYCLING RULES OF THUMB

GLASS

(CLEAR, GREEN, BROWN)

Glass food and beverage containers can be easily recycled by removing caps and lids and rinsing out the container. Labels can remain.

NEWSPAPERS

- Tie in bundles 8" - 12" high
- Do not mix with magazines, mail, corrugated, envelopes, fliers, catalogs or plastic
- Secure with twine tied in two directions
- Place next to your recycling container

PLASTICS

Only plastic soda bottles, milk jugs, water jugs, and laundry products labeled #1 or #2 are acceptable. Other plastic containers such as bowls and plates are not acceptable. Be sure to remove lids and rinse out container. Labels can remain.

MAGAZINES & JUNK MAIL

- Tie in bundles 8" - 12" high
- Acceptable items: magazines, catalogs, junk mail, school paper, computer paper
- No brown paper bags, telephone books, carbon paper or plastic
- Do not mix with newspapers or corrugated

ALUMINUM AND BIMETAL CANS

All food and beverage cans are recyclable. Rinse out cans before placing them in your recycling container. Labels can remain.

REMEMBER

All jars and bottles, metal cans, plastic bottles and jugs should be rinsed clean and placed commingled in your recycling container. DO NOT USE BOXES, PLASTIC BAGS, OR CANS LARGER THAN 26 GAL. Glass bottles and jars should not be broken before placed in container. Newspapers must be tied in both directions. Do not put in bags.

CORRUGATED CARDBOARD

- Tied and bundled (no pizza, cereal boxes)
- Do not mix with newspapers or magazines

NOT ACCEPTABLE

The following materials are not acceptable and should not be mixed in with your recyclables.
